

Power Steering Fluid Buying Guide

Understand Your Vehicle's Needs

Check your owner's manual for recommended fluid type. Using the wrong fluid can damage your steering system.

Types of Fluids

- Mineral Oil-Based: Affordable, for older cars.
- Synthetic: High-performance, great for extreme temps.
- ATF: Acceptable if manufacturer recommends it.
- Special Formulated: Brand-specific with unique additives.

Check Compatibility

Ensure the fluid is compatible with your steering system (hydraulic or electric).

Assess Your Driving Conditions

If you drive in extreme heat/cold or tow heavy loads, opt for synthetic fluids for better reliability.

- Mineral: \$5\$15
- Synthetic: \$15\$25
- Specialty: \$20\$30+
